# **Message for Pentecost**

This is a great painting, by Cassie Sears... even though it may look like a creature sprouting 7 arms. It was painted to represent someone filled with the Holy Spirit. To me, the painting is someone full of God given life and energy. When God's Spirit is in you two things happen; you have a deeper understanding that you are fully loved by God (the heart in the middle) and that love then bursts out into all the rest of your life (the 7 arms!).



Pentecost is a Jewish celebration. When the Holy Spirit first came to Jesus's friends, it was during Pentecost, and people from different countries had come to Jerusalem to celebrate. It was a few weeks after Jesus had died, been raised back to life, and then gone to heaven. The resurrected Jesus had told his followers to wait in Jerusalem... so they did - they hid, in fear of those in charge, and waited. When the Holy Spirit first came He appeared like fire descending on their heads. They lost their fear and knew what they had to do. They went outside and began telling everyone who would listen about God. When the Holy Spirit is with us, in our life, he can guide us too. The Holy Spirit guiding us can be like:

- a passion that won't go away
- a direction in life that we feel we have to take
- a desire to do something that we can't shake.

I asked people at my church to describe how the Holy Spirit helps them, they said: a Guide, Facilitator, Prompter, Peace giver, Strength at difficult times, Corrector, Comforter. The letters in the New Testament give us some long lists of ways that the Holy Spirit can help us; the gift of giving, teaching, administration, prophecy, service, hospitality... and more. I don't think this was a complete list but just a start on the list of gifts and abilities the Holy Spirit would give to Jesus' followers, then and now.

To each person who exists and has ever existed God has given gifts and abilities. That includes YOU! By accepting God into our lives we are given the Holy Spirit to help us grow and develop the gifts we have been given. God, through the Holy Spirit, wants to be active in our lives, using the gifts and passions we are given; to care for others, to speak out about injustice, to change the world for good.

Find some time to stop today. Use that time to ask God, "what are the gifts and abilities you have given me?" and then ask God to help you use them.


# Teenager's Tip Stop and Hear
