Saturday 30th November brought the Church year to an end, and the 1st of December marked the beginning of the new one with the First Sunday in Advent. Advent signifies a period of waiting as we wait for Christ to bring light into the darkest places of our lives and the world.

Advent is not Christmas; that is still to come. Advent, a time of waiting and reflection, requires us to answer the question 'What am I waiting for?' We mark the season each Sunday by lighting a candle on our Advent wreath. Each candle represents a different theme and each week, as we light another candle, more light is added to the darkness. On the First Sunday in Advent, we light the candle for hope, on Advent two, the candle of peace, Advent three is Joy, Advent four the candle representing Love, and finally on Christmas Day we light Christ's candle for the light he brings to our world in darkness.

In Advent we are waiting, and this period of waiting requires us to examine our own hearts and ask ourselves if we need to make any changes in our lives and our hearts. Is there something we need to change to make our hearts ready to receive the light the Christ child will bring on Christmas Day? Advent offers us time to reflect and pray; to think about things that we need to, or can, change. Is there something we could do that would make a difference, small or large? Is there something we could do for others? Often a simple gesture of kindness at this time of year can bring light and hope to another. Advent offers us the opportunity to clear out the darkness in our hearts and minds so that we can become Christ's light in our World.

The world around us is troubled and whilst we can't solve wars, famine, and desperate situations by ourselves we can commit to small changes that will bring light to someone in difficulty. By so doing we demonstrate Christ's love to others.

Christmas is about the birth of a baby. A Messiah. Emmanuel. God with us. It is so easy to become entangled up in the commercial side of Christmas and to lose focus on the One who can transform lives and bring hope. Let us focus on the Christ child, born to save, and to seek to have Him at the centre of our lives where he brings hope, purpose and peace.
