The Importance of Pentecost

There are many times and seasons in Christianity. The most significant to me is indeed Pentecost, not because that's when 'the Holy Spirit came' – he's been around since creation! Not even because the disciples began to demonstrate 'gifts' which WAS significant. For me it's because it was a completion; the final act in a long string of God's promises beyond the cross.



Of course, Jesus' death and resurrection were world changing but if the story ended there we would still be left fighting our own fights, struggling our own struggles, with an Old Testament 'hope' – "Maybe the Holy Spirit will intervene... come 'upon me'...." remembering all the ways the Holy Spirit empowered and quickened men and women under the 'old' covenant of daily sacrifices, future visions; remembering the prophets, David and Goliath, Samson and all the 'others' we think of somehow as Old Testament 'heroes'.

God is unfathomable – He's just too beyond our tiny minds to comprehend fully. Heaven knows He has tried over many centuries to explain to His people 'how' He works, 'what' He wanted from us, 'when' all His words would come to pass, etc. In the main His people – the individuals, the families, the nation of Israel, even the Jews to whom Jesus came and spoke to face to face – were rebellious, stiff-necked, and made light of His laws, His requests, His leading by clouds and fire, His endless prompting by His prophets.... frankly I'm amazed God took Moses at his word to *not* destroy them in the desert and just start over. But He didn't, and here we are, post Pentecost; able to simply rejoice in God's fulfilled promise of an indwelling Helper, Comforter, and much more.
