"I believe; help my unbelief."

- Mark 9:24

1. Honesty – Honesty is the start of any real relationship, including with God. Sometimes we feel like we need to hide how we're really doing. But the Bible shows us a different way. The Psalmists prayed with their whole hearts — questions, anger, sadness, hope. In Psalm 13, David says: "How long, Lord? Will you forget me forever?" That's raw. And God is big enough to handle it. Even though most of the Psalm is a cry for help, David ends by saying: "I will sing the Lord's praise, for he has been good to me." This is an example of faith and doubt, sitting together in one prayer.



- **2. Community** Community is where we bring our real selves. In Christian community, someone is always grieving and someone is always celebrating. The challenge is to make space for both. Galatians 6:2 says, "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfil the law of Christ." That means checking in, showing up, and being honest even when the answer to "How are you?" isn't "fine." Community is also a place to remind each other of what God has done. Where there has been breakthrough. We also need a place to share our joy. Hebrews 3:13 says, "Encourage one another daily... so that none of you may be hardened." Don't hold back your testimony it might be what helps someone else keep going.
- **3. Perspective** Perspective changes everything. In Mark 9, a father brings his suffering son to Jesus and says: "If you can do anything, take pity on us and help us." Jesus replies: "Everything is possible for one who believes." And the father responds honestly: "I believe; help my unbelief!" Faith isn't about trying harder. It's about remembering who we're believing in. In Mark 9, the father may have forgotten that Jesus had been healing through Israel, and he could do it again. Sometimes doubt and disappointment can skew our view of God, but when we remember who we are praying to, it can change what we are praying for!

Final Thought – If you're carrying doubts, don't hide them. Bring them into prayer, share them with trusted people, and remember who God is and what God has done!


Dear Lord,
