#### Archbishop of York's Visit to St Christopher's CE High School and Sixth Form

St Christopher's CE High School and Sixth Form were delighted to welcome the Archbishop of York, the Most Revd and Rt Hon Stephen Cottrell, for a special visit in October.

The Archbishop's visit formed part of a day of engagement and reflection across the school community, joined by the Bishop of Blackburn, the Rt Revd Philip North. In a packed programme, they met pupils, students and staff, participated in Q&A sessions, led assembly worship, celebrated Holy Communion, and had conversations about faith, leadership, and hope for the future.

The morning began with Archbishop Stephen attending the staff briefing, offering words of encouragement to teachers, and praising St Christopher's as exactly the sort of school he would have sent his own children to if he had lived in the area.

Following this, the Archbishop met with Lower Sixth students in the Lecture Theatre for an interactive Q&A session. Sixth Formers devised some excellent questions, ranging from assisted dying to his funniest story, which turned out to be one about the late Queen. It gave our Sixth Formers the opportunity to explore questions of faith, vocation, and modern life with one of the most senior leader in the Church of England.

The Bishop of Blackburn led the Year 9 assembly, before later joining Upper Sixth students for their own Q&A session. The question times were excellent opportunities for our young people to engage thoughtfully with the Church's mission and discuss how faith in Christ can inspire action and purpose in their lives.

Music played a special part in the morning. The Senior Vocals Choir, featuring pupils from Year 8 through to Upper Sixth students, performed during the Year 8 Service of Holy Communion, celebrated by the Archbishop, including a beautiful musical rendition of "The Lord's Prayer" written by Lucy Walker to mark the Archbishop's Tour.

Headmaster Richard Jones described the visit as "a wonderful opportunity for our pupils, students and staff to meet with two deeply inspiring church leaders. We were honoured to welcome the Archbishop of York and Bishop Philip to St Christopher's and were greatly inspired by a morning of conversation, worship, and reflection."

The visit formed part of the Archbishop's ongoing commitment to meeting with young people and educators across the North of England, encouraging them to live out their faith confidently and compassionately in today's world, and it was a great honour that the Archbishop chose make St Christopher's a stop on his tour.



#### **Upper Sixth Geography Fieldwork**

Our Upper Sixth A-level Geography students undertook their fieldwork visits to collect vital data for their NEA coursework.

One group visited Lytham sand dunes, studying vegetation succession and the impact of human activity on ecosystem development. Another group explored Manchester, investigating topics such as homogenisation, sense of place, environmental quality, and social deprivation. They carried out surveys, questionnaires, and assessments across the CBD, inner city, and suburbs — including a focus on how well areas cater for an ageing population.


The data and insights gathered during these visits will play a crucial role in their coursework, supporting them in completing a successful A-level Geography programme.



#### From Idea to Impact: Celebrating EPQ



This year's Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) cohort is the strongest the school has seen in both scale and substance. With forty students completing projects, the programme is a flagship for process-based learning - learning critical skills such as planning, creativity, and problem solving.

The projects themselves reflect real intellectual aims including creative artefacts and research questions that wouldn't look out of place in a university dissertation. It's not just the end product, but the way students have learned to think. The EPQ's emphasis on critical thinking, learning through errors, and evidence-based decision-making has pushed students beyond the comfort of traditional coursework. They will plan, refine, fail, recover, and improve - key habits associated with later academic success.

National research backs this up. Universities report that EPQ students arrive better prepared for independent study, with improved academic resilience, stronger writing, and more confident project management. Large cohort data shows that EPQ candidates often outperform their predicted grades at A-level, with the qualification acting as a scaffold for higher-level study skills and reflective practice.

Students learn to justify their choices, defend their methodology, and engage critically with sources. Many balanced the EPQ alongside demanding study programmes and extracurricular commitments, demonstrating the self-regulation universities routinely expect but rarely teach.

Most importantly, the students see that this isn't a linear, teacher-led course. It's an intellectual apprenticeship - one that positions students to thrive at university, where process matters as much as product. This year's forty EPQ candidates will prove that when our students are trusted with a challenge, they rise to meet it.
