Pupils and students take part in Mock Trial Competition

In October, 14 students from Lower and Upper Sixth along with Year 11 St Christopher's CE High School pupils attended Burnley Combined Court to attend a Question and Answer with His Honor Judge Mathieson, a Circuit Court Judge.

As part of their preparations for the upcoming Bar Mock Trial, they were able to find out more about the role of a Judge, jury verdicts and what a good witness examination looks like. Students were then able to observe the work of the court swearing in a jury and beginning a Crown Court prosecution for Grievous Bodily Harm.

Upper Sixth student, Scarlett Lees said of the visit:

"The trip was a great experience and it helped to bring the law to life.We are now ever more excited and committed to our Mock Trial preparations."

Then in November, the Bar Mock Trial Team and some A-level Law students took part in a Q and A with Barrister Olivia Muckherjee. Olivia has been assigned to the team to give support and feedback as the Barristers prepare their cases for the competition in December.

Olivia was enormously engaging, informative and inspiring. She told us about her own career path, what led her to specialise in family law, the reality of preparing for cases and the impact that difficult cases can have on legal professionals. Our students and team members from main school asked fantastic questions and Olivia was suitably impressed; commenting that she felt like she was being quizzed at a tenancy interview to join a chambers!

Our team braved Storm Darragh to compete in the Bar Mock Trial Competition at Preston Crown Court. They showcased incredible teamwork, critical thinking, and public speaking skills, winning two out of 3 cases!

Students Become Heroes

The Hero Project is a nationwide programme run by the blood cancer charity, Anthony Nolan. Their mission is to educate 16 to 18-year olds about stem cell, blood and organ donation, and show them that they could help save a life. Together, we can give every student the opportunity to learn about their lifesaving potential.

Chris and Jean, trained Hero Project volunteers, delivered a presentation about what stem cell, blood and organ donation involve, why they matter and how our students can become lifesaving donors if they wish to. After the presentation, our students can join the stem cell register in-school. This is a 5-minute sign-up and students could be contacted in the future to save a life.



This is about giving ourselves selflessly to others and being courageous advocates for others and the common good.

We are delighted to announce that our recent Anthony Nolan Recruitment Drive added 36 students to the stem cell donor register, offering hope to those in need of lifesaving transplants.

A huge thank you to our dedicated volunteers—Jean, Chris, and Darren—whose efforts were instrumental in helping our students sign up.

Joining the stem cell register is a powerful way to potentially save a life, and we are incredibly proud of our students for stepping forward to make a difference.

Geographers Test Theory in the Field





Students in Upper Sixth Geography were collecting their data for their NEA in Manchester.

They visited Manchester City centre (CBD); stopped at New Islington; Openshaw and Audenshaw to conduct questionnaires, environmental quality surveys and clone town surveys to help achieve the aims of their investigations.

The other set of Lower Sixth Geography students visited Lytham Sand Dunes where they measured how vegetation developed as you advance through the dune.

The focus was to see if human activity had a detrimental impact on dune development and ecosystem.

They will be comparing their data with a protected sand dune system in Formby.

Fieldwork allows them to put theory learned in the classroom to the test!

Politics Students Interview Local MP

We were delighted to welcome our recently elected Hyndburn MP for a Q and A with A-level students.

Sarah Smith MP was extremely forthcoming about how her life has changed since she entered Parliament and we were so interested to learn about her role as National Mission Champion for Opportunity which she passionately believes will help local young people. Sarah shared her views on the Whip system, the House of Lords, the work of Select Committees, and the forthcoming Assisted Dying legislation and our students of both Law and Politics learnt so much.

'Booktok Made Me Read It' lecture



All students took part in the two-minute silence to mark Armistice day.


Libby B from Upper Sixth played the Last Post on the Viola in the main school reception, with the Sixth Form students being able to watch the service at the Cenotaph.
